Sai Yeung Choi Street South, Mongkok, Kowloon



Though Hong Kong is known for its abundance of Chanel and Prada shops, there are some other reasons why it has been christened a “shopping paradise”.

Sai Yeung Choi Street South in Mongkok, Kowloon, guaranteed to pacify even the most devoted techno-junkie. The street was built on a watercress cultivation in a village, Mong Kok Tsuen (芒角村), in Mong Kok in 1924. The name



Sai Yeung Choi is the Cantonese name of watercress. As time went by, the village and fields were replaced by high-rise buildings. These are now filled with shops selling all types of electronic gadgets, so keep your eyes peeled for bargains!

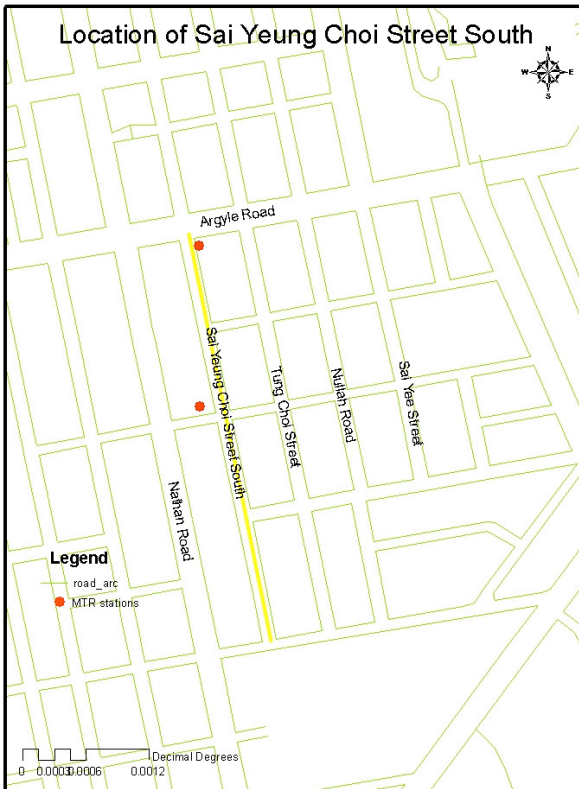


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Neighborhood

Sai Yueng Choi Street South is located in the middle of the busy hub of Mongkok. Other famous shopping streets, such as Sport Shoes Street, Ladies' Market and Nathan Road can be found within a 500 meter radius. To get to Sai Yueng Choi Street, you can take many different modes of transport.

Mode of transport	Where to get off
MTR (Mass Transit Railway)	Mongkok exit D3 and E2. Not to be confused with Mongkok East Station!
Bus (buses that pass Nathan Road, e.g. 1A, 1, 2, 6, 6A, 9)	(from Tsim Sha Tsui) Shantung Street or Soy Street (from Kowloon) Shantung Street or Dundas Street
Taxi	Argyle Center, and walk south across Argyle Road
