## Choi Sai Woo Park

Choi Sai Woo Park is a recreational area providing country and freshness amidst Hong Kong's trademark steel and glass skyline.

Choi Sai Woo Park was named after a former reservoir located within the park. This reservoir was built in 1894 and served as a crucial water supply during Hong Kong's period of drought and bubonic plague.

Later on, the reservoir was filled in to create the current park site where it became a scene of bitter fighting against the Japanese during World War II.

The park provides some insight into local culture with its stylized architecture, its distinctly local styled fitness equipment (see picture below) and its therapeutic

The park also offers small paths for pleasant walks as well as a several scenic points that have a variety of trees and flowers. Near the south end of the park, one can find a view across Hong Kong's famous Victoria Harbor.

There are also a number of amenities in the vicinity (see Commercial Center in the map on the other page), including restaurants and the local style tea shop, as well as Park N Shop and 7-Eleven outlets.
